



Rules & Regulations



1. Postal entries must be made on the official form to reach the Honey Show Secretary by Friday, 4th November 2011. Exhibitors may also submit their entries on the day, Saturday, 5th November 2011 before 10am.
2. Exhibits may not be entered in more than one class.
3. A judge may not be an Exhibitor in any class in which he/she acts as a Judge.
4. Staging of exhibits will be by appointed Stewards except in display classes.
5. The CDBKA Committee will inscribe all trophies.
6. The CDBKA Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit whatsoever.
7. The decision of the Honey Show Committee / Judges is final.
8. Exhibits must be bona fide product of the exhibitors' own bees.
9. Honey colour BSI grading glasses will be used by the Judges.
10. The Committee reserves the right not to award all or any of the prizes in any class.
11. An exhibitor shall not be entitled to more than one prize in any class or any supreme classes.
12. Wax may be exhibited polished or unpolished.
13. Sections must be enclosed in single section show cases or transparent wrapping. The comb must be visible through both sides of the case.
14. Honey must be exhibited in matching plain straight sided clear glass jars, between 300g and 500g capacity unless otherwise stated, with standard commercial lids, matching. No individual identification marks whatsoever.
15. Mead must be shown in clear, colourless bottles of round section, with rounded but not sloping shoulders and without lettering, fluting or ornamentation of any kind. Only cork stoppers with white plastic flanges to be used. No alcohol may be added to metheglin or melomel, nor may alcohol for flavouring be added to mead but additions such as acids, nutrients and tannin may be used.
16. Photographic class. All exhibits must have been taken by the exhibitor. The subject should be connected with bees or beekeeping. Each exhibit must be mounted, finished size A4. Label to be placed on the top right hand corner of the mount, 12mm approximately from top right hand side.
17. Exhibits may not be removed until after the show in the presence of a Steward.
18. Honey cake. Refer to ingredients and method on honey show brochure.
19. Every exhibitor will be issued with a honey show number label. This should be stuck to the exhibit at a height of 12.5mm approximately from the bottom of the jar, where applicable. Stewards will advise where to place honey show numbers on other classes.
20. Novice classes are open to CDBKA members only.
